b) Speeding Car, Forest Lane - Pedestrian Crossing – Near Miss Accident

The **PC** reported back to the meeting that SBC consider that there is no danger to pedestrians crossing Forest Lane having exited The Green and that it was possible to view vehicles travelling east along Forest Lane. The **PC** had written back and pointed out that it depended on how tall you are and that children crossing at the point could not see back along Forest Lane and oncoming vehicles. Children in Y6, with the permission of their parents, do walk home by themselves.
